acquire verb

to get or come to have as one's own.

Gina went to the grocery store because there were still a few items she needed to *acquire*.

Synonyms: get, obtain

Antonyms: lose, forfeit



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

aspire verb

to want strongly; have as an aim (usually followed by to or after).

I *aspire* to be the best and strongest wrestler in the world.

Synonyms: aim, long for, yearn



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

chorus noun

a part of a song that is repeated.

The *chorus* of the song is easy to remember.

Synonyms: hook, refrain

Hi, I'm a period. Not to boast,
 But I'm the end punctuation you see the most.
 I come at the end of a telling sentence,
 Those give information like, "I am a doctor!"
 A sentence with a period is a statement.
 It tells or states some information.
 Use your normal voice any time you read.
 A sentence that ends with little of me.

 You'll see me in **commercials**, too.
 Those are sentences that tell you what to do.
 "Open your mouth. Take a bite."
 Gulp! The water, and then spit it in the sink!

Do you know who I am? Have you seen me before?

 Questions often start with "Who," "Where," "What,"

 I come at the end of sentences that show excitement!

 Like if your finger gets bitten, and you yell, "Ouch!"

Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

chorus noun

a group of people who sing together.

She is singing in the high school *chorus* this year.

Synonyms: choir



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

conjure verb

to do or produce by or as if by magic or sleight of hand.

The magician was going to *conjure* a rabbit from a hat.

Synonyms: summon



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

defy verb

to resist efforts at.

This puzzle is known to *defy* solving. Don't even waste your time trying to find the solution!

Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

defy verb

to refuse to obey.

The disobedient boy was always doing something to *defy* his father's rules.



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

firebrand noun

someone who passionately incites others to conflict or action, especially illegal political action.

Lisa is a *firebrand*; she just knocked over all the boxes in the warehouse to protest the working conditions, and then her coworkers did the same!

Synonyms: rebel, agitator



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

gravity noun

very serious nature or manner.

She needed an operation because of the *gravity* of her injuries.

Synonyms: importance, severity, seriousness

Antonyms: unimportance, silliness

Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

gravity noun

the force by which all objects in the universe are attracted to each other.

Skydiving might feel like flying, but pretty soon *gravity* will pull you down to the ground.

magnetic adjective

having the power to attract people.

Ronda has a *magnetic* personality, which is probably why she's so popular.

Synonyms: attractive, alluring

Antonyms: uninteresting, repellent



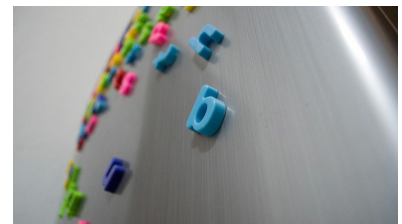
Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

magnetic adjective

able to attract iron and other metals.

Some metals are more *magnetic* than others.



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

mirth noun

happiness or gaiety, especially accompanied by laughter.

Taking a boat ride always filled Kendra with *mirth*. She loved everything about it, from the fresh breeze to the feeling of freedom.

Synonyms: glee, joy

Antonyms: melancholy, sadness, distress



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

quench verb

to satisfy.

The ice cold water is the perfect thing to *quench* my thirst.

Synonyms: satisfy, relieve



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

quench verb

to extinguish or put out.

Luckily, the firefighters were able to *quench* the car fire.

Synonyms: extinguish, put down

Antonyms: ignite



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

subtle adjective

difficult to detect or define; elusive or ambiguous.

There was *subtle* change in her son's attitude that only a very observant parent would notice.

Antonyms: obvious

Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

subtle adjective

causing delicate effects, or able to make fine distinctions.

The chicken had a very *subtle* flavor of lemon to it; I could barely taste it.

Synonyms: delicate, discriminating, faint

Antonyms: blatant, obvious, startling, unsubtle

sullen adjective

silently showing anger.

After finding out that she wasn't going to get ice cream, Malkia became *sullen* and frowned quietly.

Synonyms: glum, frowning, morose

Antonyms: cheerful

toxic adjective

containing poison.

The factory put *toxic* waste into the lake, which killed the plants that used to grow there.

Synonyms: poisonous

urgent adjective

requiring immediate action.

My boss said that the client's email was *urgent* and that I should answer it within the hour.

Synonyms: critical, pressing

caused by or showing caution.

There was a *wary* look on the girl's face when the stranger started talking to her.
