# The Party - Vocab Cards

**abode** noun

**a residence or dwelling.**

This modest cottage on the lake was the writer's summer *abode*.

Synonyms: dwelling, home, residence

**acknowledge** verb

**to admit the truth or existence of.**

She would not *acknowledge* her mistake.

Synonyms: accept, concede, recognize

Antonyms: deny, reject

Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

**acknowledge** verb

**to indicate awareness of.**

She was still angry at him, so she decided to only *acknowledge* his presence with a slight nod.

Synonyms: notice, recognize

Antonyms: ignore

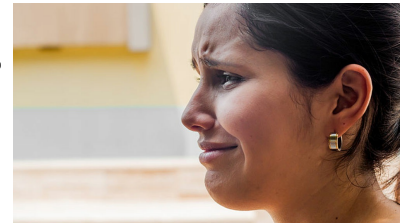
**agitate** verb

**to upset or excite.**

Any mention of the fighting tended to *agitate* her; she always started to cry.

Synonyms: disturb, trouble, upset

Antonyms: calm, lull, soothe

**dismal** adjective

**full of gloom; sad.**

It was a *dismal* day when we sold the house I grew up in.

Synonyms: bleak, gloomy, joyless

Antonyms: bright, cheerful, happy

**dismantle** verb

**to tear down; take apart.**

Ginny knew how to *dismantle* the coffee machine, but she had no idea how to put it back together.

Antonyms: assemble, build, construct

**hospitable** adjective

**friendly, giving, and warm to guests.**

Mike was very *hospitable* and gave me a warm hug when I arrived.

**implore** verb

**to beg urgently of (someone) or for (something).**

She didn't like her babysitter, so she had no choice but to *implore* her father to stay.

Synonyms: beg, beseech, plead with



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

**intensify** verb

**to become stronger and more acute.**

Instead of weakening, I fear the storm will only *intensify* as it hits the coast.

Synonyms: grow, increase, strengthen

Antonyms: calm, cool, weaken



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

**inundate** verb

**to overspread or overwhelm as if with a flood of water; deluge.**

After leaving them all to the last minute, her homework assignments began to *inundate* her.

**negligent** adjective

**not showing proper concern; careless.**

Jay is a *negligent* driver; he spends the whole time texting his friends and ignoring the other cars.

Synonyms: forgetful, inconsiderate, indifferent

Antonyms: attentive, careful, mindful

**oration** noun

**a formal, usually long speech, especially one given on an important occasion.**

At his inauguration, the president gave a carefully prepared *oration*.

Synonyms: address, speech

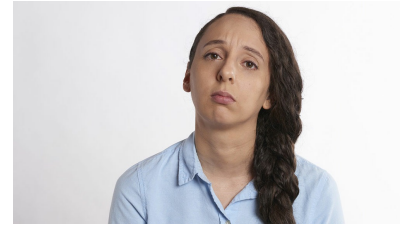
**perturb** verb

**to cause great disturbance in (the mind); agitate or worry.**

The fact that she wasn't invited to the party would *perturb* Renee for weeks.

Synonyms: disturb, upset, unsettle

Antonyms: calm, please



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

**reprimand** verb

**to express strong disapproval to, especially formally.**

Alice had to *reprimand* her son when she found him climbing on the countertops to steal junk food.

Synonyms: castigate, chastise, rebuke

Reprimand can also be used as a noun, like in this sentence: "I received an angry reprimand from my teacher for not doing my homework."

**sequel** noun

**a book or movie that is complete in itself but continues a story begun in an earlier work.**

The *sequel* to my favorite movie came out a few years after the first one.

Antonyms: original

**supervise** verb

**to direct during the carrying out of a task.**

The lifeguard was hired to *supervise* swimmers on the beach.

Synonyms: handle, manage, oversee
