browse verb

to examine things in a slow and casual way.

The store manager didn't like having kids in the store because they tended to *browse* without buying anything.

Synonyms: poke around



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

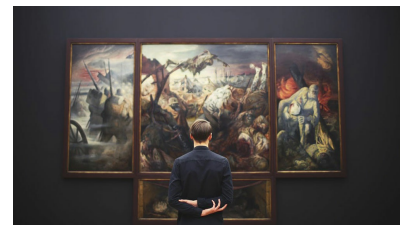
counterfeit noun

something made to look real in order to cheat people.

This painting is a *counterfeit*, but it fooled the people who bought it.

Synonyms: fake

Counterfeit can also be used as an adjective, like in this sentence: "It is against the law to use counterfeit money."

devour verb

to eat or swallow in a greedy way.

I saw the lion *devour* the meat for his dinner.

Synonyms: chow down, consume, gobble

devour verb

to take in with the mind or senses in a greedy way.

I love reading, and constantly *devour* all the books I can find by R. L. Stine.

Synonyms: consume



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

dishearten verb

to depress or destroy the hope or confidence of.

My brother wants to be a writer, but I'm worried all the rejection will *dishearten* him.

Synonyms: deject, discourage, dispirit

Antonyms: embolden, encourage, hearten

emblem noun

an object that stands for something; symbol.

A heart is an *emblem* of love.

Synonyms: insignia, mark, token

exuberant adjective

vigorously enthusiastic or happy; high-spirited.

She was *exuberant* upon hearing that she'd been accepted into the honors program.

Synonyms: ebullient, energetic, enthusiastic
Antonyms: depressed, gloomy, unenthusiastic

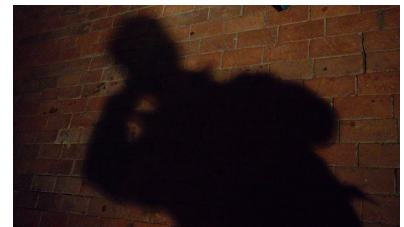
Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

lurk verb

to be hidden; lie in wait.

Joe wanted to scare his friends, so he decided to *lurk* behind a wall, and jump out when they walked past.

Synonyms: hide



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

mellow adjective

very calm and relaxed.

Our father has gotten *mellow* over the years and doesn't get upset easily.

Synonyms: easygoing, relaxed, tranquil

mellow adjective

soft or gentle in tone.

He played a *mellow* song on the guitar, and the quiet chords of it brought peace to the gathered crowd.

Synonyms: easy, muted, softened

Antonyms: gruff, hard, harsh

patronize verb

to act in an offensively superior manner toward.

When he's annoyed, our teacher will *patronize* us with his fake concern, asking if we need some pillows since it looks like we want to take a nap.

Synonyms: condescend, talk down to, treat like a child

patronize verb

to shop at or use the services of regularly.

Business is good because many people *patronize* the store.

Synonyms: buy from



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

pique verb

to cause (a feeling or action) to be aroused or incited.

Those fun and engaging songs and videos always *pique* my desire to learn more!

Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

pique verb

to incite to hostility or resentment, especially by hurting the feelings.

Coldness and hostility *pique* her; she doesn't understand why people can't just be nice.

Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

pluck verb

to grab with the fingers and pull off.

The apple on the branch looked so juicy and delicious that she decided to *pluck* it down and eat it.

Synonyms: gather, pick



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

ponder verb

to think about something deeply and carefully.

He got two job offers and had to *ponder* for a long time before he decided which one to take.

Synonyms: contemplate, mull over, reflect

Antonyms: forget, ignore



Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

Draw this vocab word or an example of it:

presume verb

to take for granted; assume.

She liked to wear her a crown so people would *presume* she was a princess.

Synonyms: believe, figure, imagine

Antonyms: disbelieve

Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

preview noun

anything that gives some idea in advance of a later event or presentation.

Fans were treated to a *preview* of the championship game when a handful of players scrimmaged on a nearby field.

Synonyms: sneak peek

Preview can also be used as a verb, like in this sentence: "Ms. Turner previewed the movie to make sure it was appropriate for her kids."

Use this word in a sentence or give an example to show you understand its meaning:

recede verb

to move back to the same low level or point as before.

The flood waters will *recede* after the rain stops.

Synonyms: decline, ebb, withdraw

Antonyms: advance, increase
