I asked my mom to *edit* my paper to make sure there were no mistakes in it before I turned it in.







# publish verb to prepare and print something for the public to read. It takes a lot of work to publish a magazine. You need writers, editors, designers, and printers. ### **research** noun

## careful study of something in order to find out information about it.

Dr. Mendez uses a microscope in her *research* when she studies things that are too small to see with the naked eye.

## revise verb

to rewrite, correct or edit in order to improve.

I need to *revise* my essay before turning it in; I have some ideas on how to improve the flow of ideas.

## rough draft noun

a rough or preliminary sketch of a piece of writing, or a version that will be revised later.
